## **RESOLUTION NO. 18-164 C.S.**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY

### AMEND THE MONTEREY CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE TO UPDATE THE LIST OF THOSE POSITIONS REQUIRED TO FILE CONFLICT OF INTEREST STATEMENTS (FPPC FORM 700)

WHEREAS, amendments to the Political Reform Act, Government Code sections 81000, et. seq., have in the past and foreseeably will in the future require conforming amendments to be made in Conflict of Interest Codes adopted and promulgated pursuant to its provisions;

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard model Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which will be amended to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings conducted by the Fair Political Practices Commission pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code section 11370, et. seq.;

WHEREAS, incorporation by reference of the terms of the aforementioned regulation and amendments to it in Conflict of Interest Codes saves the City time and money by minimizing the actions required to keep the Code in conformity with the Political Reform Act;

WHEREAS, the City of Monterey determined that the proposed action is not a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)(CCR, Title 14, Chapter 3 ("CEQA Guidelines), Article 20, Section 15378). In addition, CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 includes the general rule that CEQA applies only to activities which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA. Because the proposed action and this matter have no potential to cause any effect on the environment, or because it falls within a category of activities excluded as projects pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378, this matter is not a project. Because the matter does not cause a direct or any reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change on or in the environment, this matter is not a project. Any subsequent discretionary projects resulting from this action will be assessed for CEQA applicability.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY:

- 1. All previously adopted resolutions approving various separate Conflict of Interest Codes are hereby rescinded and superseded.
- 2. The terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730, as it may be amended from time to time by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with the attached Exhibit "A" in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code for all departments and agencies of the City of Monterey.

- 3. The FPPC's 2018 Local Agency Biennial Notice is attached as Exhibit "B" to the resolution, declaring that the City Council has reviewed the most recently previous adopted Conflict of Interest Code and determined that this amendment is required.
- Designated officials and employees shall file statements of economic interests with the City Clerk, who will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction.
- 5. In completing statements of economic interest, all designated officials and employees must disclose all investments and business positions in business entities within the City of Monterey's jurisdiction, sources of income from entities within the City of Monterey's jurisdiction, and interests in real property located within the City of Monterey's jurisdiction.

## REQUIREMENTS BY CATEGORY

### Category I Definition:

An appointed board, committee, or commission member or a designated City employee in this category must report investments, business positions, interests in real property, and sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments from third parties (not the City) within the City of Monterey's jurisdiction. See FPPC Form 700 for more details.

## Category II Definition:

An elected official, appointed commissioner, or a designated City employee in this category must report investments and business positions in business entities, and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments from (3rd parties (not the City) within the City of Monterey's jurisdiction that:

- (A) Are, or were, during the previous two years a "candidate," "public official," "committee," "lobbyist," "lobbying firm," or "lobbyist employer" within the meaning of the Political Reform Act, or file periodic reports pursuant to Government Code Sections 86114 and 86116; or
- (B) Are attorneys that represent persons described in Category 2A in matters directly related to their status as described in Category 2A; or
- (C) Are committee treasurers; or
- (D) Were the subject of a compliant to, investigation by, or enforcement action of, the Commission, that was acted upon or participated in by the filer during the period covered by the statement.

Consultants				

Consultants are defined for reporting purposes as persons who prepare a product or perform services of a general nature and/or on an on-going basis and participate by direct advice to the decision makers. Generally, consultants who prepare a product or perform services for a single specific matter are not the type of consultants required to be covered by a code, whereas consultants who provide more general assistance and advice to a government agency on an ongoing basis should be covered.

Consultants shall be included in the list of designated employees and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

The City Manager may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "Designated Position", is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties, and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The City Manager's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code.
